



Instructions on making presentation for e-Poster


-MS PowerPoint & Video Recording-





Please read the instructions below thoroughly before making your presentation.

- 1. The slide size of your presentation file (*ppt, *pptx) should be **landscape orientation**.
 - **Size: (In cm) 136 width x 76.002 height / (In pixels) 1920 width x 1080 height
- 2. Recording function in MS PowerPoint only available in 2010 and higher versions.
- 3. The video presentation should include **your voice.**
 - ** Please make sure to turn microphone on, camera off and camera preview off on and the right bottom of screen.




- 4. We highly recommend you use a **separate mic system (such as earphone with mic)** other than the built-in mic in order to minimize the noises.
- 5. Please check that your presentation file is saved as MP4 format.
- 6. File size should be **no larger than 200MB**
- 7. Make sure to create the video presentation within the assigned presentation time.

1. Click Slide Show → Record Slide Show * → Record from Beginning






3. Recording & Finish

- After finishing the recording, close the recording page.





1. Create a Video



2. Save as type: MPEG-4 Video








♦ How to save
